Please Read Carefully

Entering the 2010 Flower Show

Entries close Friday, July 23, 2010 at 4:00 p.m. for all Flower Show exhibits.

Location of the Flower Show Bldg; West of 4-H Bldg. Parking is the same as previous yrs.

You may mail your entry forms to the Lake County Fair, P.O. Box 327, Crown Point, IN 46308. All entries must be made on the entry form furnished by the Secretary and Exhibitors' name signed thereto. One entry per line on entry form. If you need more entry forms, contact the Secretary's Office at 219-663-3617 www.lake-county-fair.com.

Each Exhibitor will be required to purchase an Exhibitor's ticket for \$12.00, good for one person each day of the Fair. If entries are made and no exhibits are brought to the Fair, the Exhibitor ticket is forfeited.

Entry tags will be ready MONDAY, AUG. 2 and can be picked up in the Secretary's office in the Family Arts & Crafts Building.

Rubber bands will be provided at the Flower Show. Each Exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired, but only one entry in each class, except where divisions are specified. Arrangements entered in a previous Flower Show may NOT be entered a second time.

The Day of Show

Entries will be received for each show on day of judging from 7:45 A.M. to 9:30 a.m. Entries will close promptly at 9:30 A.M. Late Entries WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Please bring all TAGS & containers with you. Tags may be attached to containers before they are brought in for each show. ALL exhibitors must register at the placement table. All entries must be signed for as they are brought in.

All arrangements must be presentation ready. Exhibitors may not place exhibits for placement on show tables, only Show Committee Officials may do so.

JUDGING

Judging will begin promptly at 10 A.M. Judges decisions are final

AFTER THE SHOW

Containers/exhibits and ribbons must be picked up on the closing day of the show between 8 pm & 9:30 pm. They will not be mailed. The only exception is Permanent Arrangements which will be displayed the entire fair.

On the second Sun, Aug. 15, exhibits will be Released from 8:00 P.M. to 9:30 P.M. NO EXCEPTIONS. Exhibits will also be released on Tuesday Aug. 17 from 11 am to 6 pm. If not picked up, containers will be disposed of at the discretion of the Superintendent.

The Flower Show will exercise due caution in safeguarding exhibits during the Fair. It will in No Case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Exhibits are accepted on this condition.

DESIGN RULES

Maximum width for arrangements is 30 inches per design which will be measured. Plant material used in Design Classes does not have to be grown by Exhibitor. Please keep in mind our display are 12" inch deep shelves. Arrangements should be designed to display in this space.

Designs will not be judged on size unless they exceed the maximum dimensions. Maximum size for Miniature Design cannot exceed 5 inches in any dimension. It will be measured. Exhibitors are to classify their entry in the class of choice. Please have proper hooks to hang.

WALL OR DOOR DESIGNS ARE SPECIFIED UNDER CLASS NUMBER.

All exhibits in design must contain some plant material, fresh and/or silk and dried, as specified in the schedule.

- B. Quality of workmanship & Material
- C. Creativity and Originality
- D. Conformance to Theme of Class

RULES FOR HORTICULTURAL CLASSES

All Horticulture exhibits must be grown by Exhibitor In his own garden within his own yard. Exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired, but only one Entry in each class, except where divisions are specified.

If there is a specific category, the exhibit cannot be placed in another category.

When more than one bloom is specified, they must be **ONE COLOR AND ONE VARIETY**

All specimens should be groomed for removal of all dust, spray and insects. Foliage should not be cut off.

Containers for exhibits must be furnished by Exhibitor and should be **CLEAR** glass - 8, 16, or 32 ounce bottles or vases preferred, depending on size of exhibit. We are **NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR CONTAINERS.**

Please label **ALL** Specimens. They must be labeled with the correct Botanical Name when possible. The Common name may be added.

Entries will be received for each show between 7:45 & 9:30 a.m. Entries will close promptly at 9:30 AM. Late entries will not be accepted.

JUDGING WILL BEGIN PROMPTLY AT 10 AM
Judges decisions are final.

ROSE SHOW RULES

You MUST SPECIFY COLOR of Rose on entry form or your entry WILL NOT be accepted.

Roses should be ½ to ¾ open.

Please label ALL ROSES with the correct botanical name on your entry tag. This will make it possible to check on the color category.

The following A. R. S. Guidelines for judging Roses is for your information only

- Form25 points
- Color 20 points
- Substance ... 15 points
- Size ... 10 points
- Stem & Foliage ... 20 points
- Balance & Proportion 10 points
